LOOKING BACKWARDS, LOOKING FORWARDS: ANGLO-POLISH LEGAL RELATIONS AFTER BREXIT

Conference in honour of the life and work of His Hon George Dobry CBE QC

Abstract: A conference to reflect on the past and present contributions to Anglo-Polish legal relations of George Dobry and his legal projects (including the <u>British Law Centre</u> and <u>Slynn Foundation</u>), and to discuss the opportunities and difficulties that Brexit may create.

The guest list is extremely impressive and comprises genuine experts and authorities in their various fields, from both the UK and Poland, including Lord Carnwath of the UK's Supreme Court. The speakers tackle themes ranging from commercial, finance and banking law to human rights, environmental and constitutional law. The participants will discuss areas of substantive law that will influence Anglo-Polish relations post-Brexit. The British Embassy will also provide update on the latest Brexit developments. Many of the speakers also have personal links with George Dobry or his projects – where this is the case, they will also explain how Judge Dobry or his projects impacted on their own lives or professional experience.

His Honour George Dobry worked tirelessly to encourage Anglo-Polish legal relations and played an important role in inspiring developments in the Polish legal system after 1989. He was appointed Commander of the British Empire (CBE) in 1977 and Commander, Starred Cross, of Poland's Order of Merit in 1999. He also received the Gold Medal of the Polish Bar.

He was born on 1st November 1918 and died on 14th March 2018, so the conference take part not only at a time of intense developments in the Brexit process but also in the week in which HH George Dobry would have celebrated his 101st birthday. He will be sorely missed by all those attending the conference, including his wife and many close friends.
