POLAND


UNIVERSITY OF WARSAW

University of Warsaw (UW) was established in 1816 as the Royal University of Warsaw, and the largest in Poland. From the beginning the University of Warsaw has played a major role in the intellectual, political, and cultural life of Poland. Dynamic political, social, and economic changes accompanying Poland's democratisation have brought the University new opportunities and challenges. Interest in studying at UW results above all from the University's prestige – something UW has earned through the high educational level it offers and the research work.

Today, UW provides educational services for over 54.000 students, 3.000 doctoral students, 7.000 postgraduate students, and employs over 6.200 employees. They are divided for over 20 faculties and more than 30 centers. The University is divided into 3 main campuses — in Ochota (Natural Sciences), Mokotów (Management, Linguistics, European Studies), and the Main Campus as well as a number of locations spread throughout the city centre (Sociology, International Relations, Economics). The Main Campus hosts inter alia the Faculty of Law and Administration and is rapidly expanding through the Powiśle District down to the Vistula River.

The Faculty of Law and Administration is one of the oldest faculties at the University of Warsaw. The School of Law and Administration was established in 1811 and was incorporated by the newly established Royal University of Warsaw and the Faculty of Law and Administration.

After liberation in 1918, Republic of Poland nourished colossal developments of the Polish statehood and University of Warsaw alike. The dynamic growth of the University and its Faculty of Law and Administration was stopped when the Secret Faculty Council took all necessary decisions, defined the functions of institutes and ran clandestine courses as most other faculties of the University of Warsaw. The University has renewed its activity in May 1945. In July 1945, the Faculty of Law started teaching activities as well.






There are about 6.000 students of 1st, 2nd and single cycle students, numerous postgraduate students as well as few hundreds of PhD students at the Faculty of Law and Administration. We continuously develop our international relations.

Every year we send abroad over 120 students, doctoral students and staff, and accept over 70 international ones. Moreover, we also provide some academic staff exchange. We also cooperate with some American, British, and German universities, and other institutions worldwide.







COURSES

Exchange students are free to choose among the selection of courses offered by the Faculty and the University. Our Faculty offers a wide range of lectures and classes in English. Many regular courses are held in English, however students who feel confident in Polish can take regular classes. Those who develop a particular interest in some area of Polish law can benefit from tutorials with professors who have expertise in the subject.

Polish language and culture, on the other hand, are taught at the University's Centre of Polish Language and Culture for Foreigners "Polonicum".

THE WINTER SEMESTER

October 1st 2022 - February 19th 2023

The winter semester includes teaching from October 3rd 2022 till January 29th 2023,

and allows for the following days off:

- November 1st All Saints Day
- November 11th the National Independence Day
- December 22nd 2022 January 8th 2023 is the winter break for Christmas and the New Year

The winter semester's examination session runs from January 30th till February 12th 2023, and the winter semester's exam retake session starts on February 24th 2023 and ends on March 5th 2023.

The inter-semester break runs from February 13th till February 19th 2023. **THE SUMMER SEMESTER**

February 13th 2023 - September 30th 2023

The summer semester includes teaching from February 20th 2023 till June 18th 2023,

and allows for the following days off:

- April 6th April 11th Easter break
- May 1st Labour Day
- May 3rd Constitution Day
- May 12th May 13th student festival days (Iuvenalia)
- June 8th Corpus Christi

The summer semester's examination session runs from June 19th to July 9th 2023, and the summer semester's exam retake session starts on August 28th 2023 and ends on September 10th 2023.
