ABOUT THE PROJECT

The aim of the PROM project is to increase the internationalization of research by offering a financial support for short-term study visits in Poland. The project is addressed to students and PhD students from selected countries: Angola, Antiqua and Barbuda, Argentina, Australia, Bahamas, Bangladesh, Barbados, Belize Bolivia, Botswana, Brazil, Brunei, Chile, Canada, China, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Eswatini, Fiji, Grenada, Guyana, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Indonesia, Jamaica, Japan, Cambodia, Colombia, Kiribati, Comoros, South Korea, North Korea, Costa Rica, Laos, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Maldives, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mexico, Micronesia, Myanmar, Mozambique, Namibia, Nauru, Nicaragua, New Zealand Zealand, Palau, Panama, Papua New Guinea, Paraguay, Peru, South Africa, Saint Kitts Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, El Salvador, Samoa, Seychelles, Singapore, Sri Lanka, United States, Suriname, Taiwan, Tanzania, Thailand.

Following activities may be covered by the project and will be eligible for a scholarship:

- teaching at the University of Warsaw;
- participation in short education forms, i.e. in courses, workshops, study visits at the University of Warsaw;
- carrying out archive/library queries;
- participation in preparation of an international grant application;
- vother short education forms facilitating increasing competences of a project participant

The study visit must last 14 days. The visit must be carried out before 31 December 2025.

SCHOLARSHIP

Each participant will receive:

- a scholarship in the amount of 1050 PLN for students and 1750 PLN for PhD students.
- a lump sump to cover the cost of living in the amount of 4200 PLN,
- a lump sump to cover the travel fees in the amount of 6500 PLN.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Candidates must:

- which is a student oraz PhD student from one of the above mentioned countries,
- ☑ demonstrate a need of acquiring new skills or increasing competence at the University of Warsaw,
- ✓ have an outstanding academic record,
- whave a strong development potential in his/her career,
- demonstrate English language proficiency (min. level B2).

Recruitment procedures are carried out in accordance with the principle of equality and nondiscrimination. All applications will be evaluated regardless of age, disability, race, nationality, political beliefs, trade union affiliation, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation or any other personal characteristic protected by the law.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Prepare following documents in English:

☑ a personal questionnaire and an invitation from the University of Warsaw's representative;

☑ a brief research plan (can be prepared using bullet points);

✓ a short curriculum vitae (max. 1 page);

▼ TOEFL, IELTS or other test report to prove English language proficiency;

recommendation letters from professors.

2. Fill out the application form available via Google Forms: https://forms.gle/EkxsYpEtAQxE5EfB7

3. Wait for official confirmation and plan the details of your stay.

Once admitted to the program, each participant will be asked to sign a scholarship contract that will provide a legal basis for financing their visit in Poland. Due to the PROM Program strict regulations, unfortunately we are not able to pay out your scholarship in advance. The University will reimburse the above mentioned costs by bank transfer to your account stated in the contract once you arrive in Warsaw.
